BRIDGE COTTAGE

ORIGINALLY BRIDGE COTTAGE WAS BUILT OF STONE. IN 1876 IT WAS BURNT DOWN AND SUBSEQUENTLY ENLARGED AND BRICK FACED. AT THIS TIME THE COTTAGE WAS PROBABLY THE HOME OF WILLIAM LAWES THE SHEPHERD DEPICTED AS ISAAC BAWCOMBE IN W.H. HUDSON'S 'THE SHEPHERD'S LIFE'.

IT WAS AT ONE TIME THE VILLAGE POST OFFICE AND LATER THE COTTAGE WAS ATTACHED TO KING'S FARM. THE DOCTOR'S SURGERY WAS THERE TOO.
