

TALK'S FARMHOUSE, EAST MARTIN.

THIS FARMHOUSE SHOWS CLEAR EVIDENCE OF ITS 17TH CENTURY

ORIGINS AS A SMALL TWO ROOM COTTAGE, WITH SUBSEQUENT ADDITIONS

USING DIFFERENT SUILDING CONSTRUCTION AND MATERIALS FOR EACH

PERIOD. THE MATERIALS USED INCLUDE TIMBER, COB, BRICK, FLINT AND

STONE. THE HOUSE'S GEORGIAN FAÇADE AND INCREASED ROOF HEIGHT

WERE POSSIBLY ADDED BY WILLIAM TALK TO REFLECT HIS ACQUIRED

SOCIAL STANDING. THIS FAÇADE, THE BARNS AND THE THATCHED COB GARDEN

WALL ARE LISTED GRADE II. THE NAME DERIVES FROM WILLIAM TALK,
