I was contacted by Nigel Turton to make a new cross for the green at Martin .
There had been a obelisk on top of a remaining eroded plinth .

A new brief was decided -to celebrate the connection with Glastonbury Abbey and the Wiltshire
long horn sheep that brought it prosperity .

We discovered that the centre of the nave and the
present cross site was 37.5 miles as the crow flies .

Chicksgrove stone is quarried just outside
Tisbury .We decided on a tooled finish to soften the
impact and encourage weathering.

The plinth is similar to the original and the shaft and
lantern of a traditional style evident in southern
England .

Robert Snowball a resident at Rockbourne helped
me to fix this cross . We bedded it on lime mortar



with stainless steel securing pins .
It was a great pleasure and honour to have
done this cross .
